ECI Press Note States 75 Candidates from **West Bengal will be Contesting** in Phase 4 of Lok Sabha **Elections 2024 in 8 PCs**

Press: Election Commission of India (ECI) in a **Press Note** issued today stated 75 candidates from West Bengal will be contesting in the Phase 4 of Lok Sabha Elections. a total of 138 nomination forms were received for the phase 4 of **General Election** in West Bengal, stated the Press Note. After withdrawal, 75 candidates will be contesting. A total of 4624 nominations were filed for 96 **Parliamentary** Constituencies (PCs) across 10 States/ UTs. The last date for filing of

nominations for Phase 4 for all these States was April 25, 2024. Across the country 1970 nominations were found to be valid. After withdrawal, the number of final contesting candidates is 1717. In West Bengal, 75 candidates were found to be valid after scrutiny. In the fourth phase of the General Election, eight PCs will go for polling. They are Baharampur, Krishnanagar, Ranaghat (SC), Bardhaman Purba (SC), Bardhaman-Durgapur, Asansol, Bolpur (SC) and Birbhum.

Both sides to finalise Local Currency Settlement System Agreement soon

The International Press : A seven-member delegation from India led by Additional Secretary, Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Shri AmardeepSingh Bhatia, accompanied by High Commissioner of India to Federal Republic of Nigeria, Shri G Balasubramanian and Economic Adviser, Department of Commerce, Ms. Priya P. Nair held a Joint Trade Committee (JTC) meeting with their Nigerian counterparts in Abuja from 29.04.2024 to 30.04.2024. The JTC was co-chaired by Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Industry Trade and Investment, Nigeria, Ambassador Nura Abba Rimi; and Additional Secretary, Department of Commerce In a comprehensive dialogue, both sides undertook a detailed review of recent

developments in bilateral trade and investment ties and acknowledged the vast untapped potential for further expansion. 

Tearful Thiago Silva to leave Chelsea at end of season

The International Press: Brazilian defender Thiago Silva will leave Chelsea at the end of the season after a "dream" fouryear spell at Stamford Bridge.

Silva announced his farewell on Monday in an emotional video message on Chelsea's website.

The 39-year-old centre-back arrived at the Premier League club on a free transfer in August 2020 after leaving Paris Saint-Germain.

He has made 151 appearances in all competitions for the Blues, winning the Champions League, FIFA Club World Cup and the UEFA Super Cup.

"Chelsea means a lot to me. I came here with the intention of only staying for a year and it ended up being four years. Not just for me but for my family, too," Silva said during a tearful goodbye speech.

"My sons play for Chelsea so it's a source of great pride to be a part of the Chelsea family. I hope they can continue their careers here at this victorious club that



many players wish to be part of.

"I think in everything I did here over the four years, I always gave my all. But unfortunately, everything has a start, a middle and an end.' Silva was a popular figure among Chelsea fans after making an immediate impact in their 2020-21 Champions Leaguewinning campaign, which climaxed with victory over Manchester City in the

The fond feelings are clearly mutual as Silva saluted the fanbase and revealed his intention to return to Chelsea in a different capacity in the future. "It's an indescribable love. I can only say thank you," he said. "Definitely a dream. Not even in my wildest dreams did I imagine that I could achieve such great things and win one of the best professional titles, the Champions League, at one of the biggest clubs in the world.

"Goodbyes are for those that leave and don't come back. I intend on coming back one day. I hope to leave the door open so that in the near future I can return, albeit in another role here." Capped 113 times by Brazil, Silva has made 34 appearances in all competitions for Chelsea this season. But the former AC Milan star suffered a groin problem in Chelsea's 2-2 draw at Aston Villa on

Saturday, raising the

possibility that he has made his last appearance in the blue shirt.

Mauricio Pochettino's side have five games left this season as they look to salvage a disappointing season by securing European qualification. Chelsea, languishing in ninth place in the Premier League, lost in the FA Cup semi-finals to Manchester City recently and were beaten by Liverpool in the League Cup final in February.

The 33vear-old became the first bowler to claim 200 IPL wickets and has made a strong case to join the Indian team for the upcoming T20 World Cup.

But is his place in the India squad already cemented? If we take a look at the dynamics of the Indian team in the past year or so. Chahal is way down the pecking order. As a leg-spinner, Ravi Bishnoi and Rahul Chahar have played regularly for India. But Chahal's stellar form in the IPL has boosted

his cause. Former India player Irfan Pathan recently said he would rather have Ravi Bishnoi and Kuldeep Yadav as spinners. Given Chahal's not-so-good fielding quality, which is essential in the T20 format, the Haryana-born can be axed.

"I would rather have two

proper wrist spinners playing, Bishnoi and Kuldeep, in my playing 11. If you look at Bishnoi's numbers, you know, when he played as well, he was pretty good. Yes, we're talking about Chahal right now, because of the IPL performances and everything but don't the fielding part of it as well. If you have to balance the fielding, you have to balance the, you know, where a bowler can bowl at the particular area," Pathan said on a Star Sports show. But soon after that. Pathan had to go contradictory to his own statement. Chahal has been a match winner for India and his IPL teams over the years. The experience and the skill propel him forward in the race and someone like the leg-spinner can be the difference maker for India, as Pathan echoed. "I reckon the last time he was playing in the World Cup, and

I was doing the pre show, before the semi-final. And everyone had a say, and they were talking about a variety of things, and I said just get Yuzi Chahal in the playing eleven and you will go to the final. And I believed that at that particular time. You need that wrist spinner, and you have to find him in the playing eleven. It wasn't the case and we saw what happened in the semi-final," he added.

The extent of PSG's financial advantage over the rest of French football is crushing and means ending each season as champions is effectively a minimum requirement. When analysts Deloitte published their list of the topearning football clubs in the world for last year, PSG were third with revenue of just over 800 million euros (\$855m). The only other French team in the top 20 was Marseille, with 258 million euros UEFA's own European Club

Finance report, published in February, revealed PSG as having the second highest wage bill on the continent behind only Barcelona, at over 600 million

Those wage costs will have changed significantly this season, following the departures of Lionel Messi and Neymar, but a recent study by sports daily L'Equipe claimed that the 10 highest-paid players in Ligue just now all play in Paris In that context, it is almost impossible for anyone to compete with Luis Enrique's

team domestically, but the Spanish coach still deserves credit. "Given our history and our

squad, we are the favourites, although not everybody manages to do it, especially with so many games still to play," he said last week "But I have said since the very first day that we are the favourites, that we have the best squad and the biggest budget. It is almost an obligation.'
